Who can apply?

You should be highly motivated to be a headteacher, no more than 12-18 months from applying for headship posts and ready to take up a headship as soon as you graduate.

You will need to have the full support and endorsement of your headteacher, line manager or sponsor. Your line manager will also have to commit to playing an active role in your learning, and encourage and promote your involvement in leadership and other professional development opportunities. You should make your application via the National College website.
